Job purpose

The Anaesthetist works as part of the ICRC or the IFRC surgical team and assesses patients' health and discusses which type of anaesthetic is suitable for them, administer appropriate anaesthetics before surgery, monitor patients' wellbeing during surgery and provide care after medical procedures. The Anaesthetist also deals with emergencies in theatre. As the part of surgical teams the Anaesthetist works either in hospitals built, equipped, supplied and managed by the ICRC or IFRC, or in existing hospitals to which the Red Cross/Red Crescent Movement provides supplies and equipment, reinforces local personnel including assisting with training.

Role (Job Requirements)

Job duties and responsibilities

- 1. Support the establishment and management of the anaesthesia unit and recovery ward, in cooperation with the surgeon and operating theatre nursing staff
- 2. Performs safe pre/per and post anaesthesia procedures during surgical interventions, in line with the internationally recognized standards, and provide adequate patient post-operative care (including pain management).
- 3. Organizes, coordinates and ensures that all required resources are available to conduct safe anaesthesia procedures
- 4. With the other members of the surgical team, manages, trains and supervises and supports the local counterparts to maintain/develop the local capacities and reach international standards
- 5. In case of field deployment, participates and ensures the availability of all necessary materials, drugs and consumables to perform safe anaesthesia during emergencies
- 6. Implements quality assurance tools to ensure compliance with medical standards, policies, guidelines and protocols
- 7. Ensures quality of care through regular staff training, meetings and evaluations
- 8. Coordinates data collection, analysis, monitoring and reporting to improve the quality of care
